"A hundred years from now it will not matter what my bank account was, the sort of house I lived in, or the kind of car I drove... But the world maybe different because I was important in the life of a child." - Kathy Davis

Upon reading this quote I could not help but feel as though this was the whole reason behind my decision to pursue a career in education. All my life I have taken joy in helping others to succeed and it has always brought me joy to make an impact on the lives of others. I have never cared about getting anything in return, just that I have made a difference, may be brightened someone's day. To me, this is exactly what teaching is all about.
